NOVEMBER CITY MEETING COUNCIL MEETING – HOPPING MAD! by Tom Wynn



The City of Wewahitchka Council voted 5 to 0 approving to have a meeting with the Contractor and his bonding company on site at the new fire station. The mayor as well as the entire Wewahitchka Commission all agreed the quality of the fire house construction is subpar. They questioned Mr. Jack Husband for his concerns as he too had many. He agreed with the council that something had to be done and done quickly.

Mayor Phil Gaskin used a colorful word to describe the work quality of the site. I am being nice here folks! He was very saddened to have to use such wording, but it just was fitting for what the commission was seeing at the site of construction. From the concrete to the steel work, to the brick already laid, the quality and errors were just not acceptable to them (keep in mind, these men have been in the contracting and construction business most of their lives). The work thus far, being below standards, may have to be redone, one commissioner pointed out. They all agreed, including the city lawyer, that something had to be done. Ms. Rachel, our city clerk, pointed out that Wewa had until April 2022 to finish the project or be subject to losing the money from FEMA. We are on a deadline, folks!

Tom Wynn spoke up with a question concerning the possibility of someone inspecting the work who has experience with this type of construction (asked in the hopes that Mr. Ralph Fisher would volunteer). Before anyone else could speak up, the mayor quickly said that Mr. Fisher was able to do that inspection, as he had many years' experience building such structures. Mr. Fisher agreed. TW

Later they voted to have a meeting with the contractor and the bonding company on-site and then a city meeting a few hours later to decide what would happen next. 
THE WEWA WOMAN'S CLUB WORKS TOWARD VET PROJECT COMPLETION

Visit our local library and check out all we have to offer. The library will be displaying our newly purchased books on Florida history and genealogy, donated Wewahitchka High School yearbooks, and collected Gulf County Breeze newspapers as well as The Wewa News newspapers is archived. Residents can enjoy available

artifacts currently on display at the library. Local photographs and old maps and such that have been collected, thus far. If you have not recently visited the library, we have purchased a collection of 10 framed prints representing Wewahitchka' history from the Florida Memory website.

We are extremely excited about our collaboration with the University of Florida Digital Newspaper Library. A deadline has been set for October 15 for the final collection of the Gulf County Breeze (we have all of the old and new Wewa News newspapers on the shelf). Please contact the library for more information on the years and issues needed. The Gulf County Breeze newspaper was published from 1925-2013 but has never been digitized. Once digitized, anyone will be able to access the University of Florida website and access all the historic information they contain.

Beginning in September we began our Seed Library. It is off to a great start! Each person may receive 5 packs of seeds per month with their library card. There are vegetables and wildflowers with the addition of herbs in the spring. This is a collaboration with the library, University of Florida Agricultural Extension office, and the Port St. Joe Garden Club. Our library is currently open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9-5 CT. JL

Worldwide Silver Use Grows High and Getting Higher

Considering the record growth in demand last year, all signs are pointing to a continuous increase. In 1980, the world population was 4.6 billion. We've since added another 2.5 billion people. Silver is required in a multitude of industrial, electrical, consumer, health, and energy-related applications critical to today's modern economy. (It is the world's best conductor of electricity and heat, best natural biocide, and best reflector of light.) Unlike other metals, it is consumed in very small increments, making recycling very difficult. In other words, once it is used, it is usually gone forever, practically speaking. At the same time, it is generally an incidental cost in the products that use it – such that a dramatic increase in the price will not necessarily cause substitution. A hint of shortages could cause industry users suddenly to hoard the metal and drain remaining available inventories. TW



ETYMOLOGY OF WORDS

What does the word "sozo" Mean?

"Sozo" is a Greek word often translated as "saved, healed, delivered." The word is used over 100 times in the New Testament of the Bible to refer to the "complete package" of salvation, deliverance and healing. For instance, in the story of the ten lepers in Luke 17:11–19, nine were "cleansed" of their leprosy, and the one that went back to Jesus praising God for his healing was "sozoed" (i.e. cleansed and made whole).

Here are some scriptures to study and meditate on: Salvation: "That if you confess with your mouth Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead you shall be saved (*sozo*)." Romans 10:9

The Smithsonian Institute was glad to finally get and accept the newly restored, to its former glory, the HH52A Helicopter CG 1426 called, "Sea Guard." Its greatest fame of all came in the early morning hour of 5 am at Air Station Houston Texas on 1 November 1979.

I was standing SAR (search and rescue) air crewmen that night. That chilly morning in 1979 at 5:05 am we got the call. We were in the air in 7 minutes, a world record. We responded within 7 minutes into the air (don't ask me how, but my crew told me, I claimed into the helo half-dressed and barefooted). It turned out to be the worst modern maritime disaster ever up and to that time (it is still listed in the top 10 worst oil spills disasters in human history). A Liberian-flagged tanker, "The Burmah Agate" carrying 300,000 barrels of crude oil collided with the Liberianflagged freighter "Mimosa" off Galveston, resulting in a massive fire. We rescued 22 survivors (another helicopter then rescued an additional five survivors during the morning daylight). More details of this case may be seen in the Washington Post article (google: Tom Wynn saves 22 lives) written back in 2016 and my book, published In cerebration of this year's Veterans Day, I am releasing my story to the public.

This was the night I changed my lifestyle for evermore. You could say I saw Hell on earth up front and personal. 27 saved (5 saved by the second helo CG 1466), 28 lost that night by fire and sea. USCG Air Station Houston flew on that case for 68 more days and nights. USCG Cutters and boats looked for dead bodies and worked hard to recover evidence of what in the world happened.

In late 2014, The USCG Aviation Association had purchased the HH-52A—tail number 1426—from the North Valley Occupational Center in Van Nuys, California,

The Coast Guard Aviation Association purchased the old bird. The airframe had an amazing story to tell the world, which had been set aside over the many years' Lieutenants Chris Kilgore and LCDR J.C. Cobb, along with Petty Officer 2nd class Thomas "Tom" Wynn Jr. were the crew that rescued 22 men from an inferno and the abyss covered with flaming dark crude oil. This was written about in over 19 different Aviation Magazines during the years 2016/17.

Today this flying boat hangs in glory in an airconditioned structure so all the world can see with amazement, just a short distance is the Space shuttle housed in its own location hanger.

As it hangs today, it is a memorial to the many men and women of the USCG Aviation team that worked on it, flew it and loved it. We spend our youth and strength to keep it in the air to save all the lives that called out to the Coast Guard for help. We loved our jobs and would do it all over again, I am sure. God is good to those that love others and are willing to present their own lives before danger, to save another. May God bless those that flew and worked in the past and today in the USCG Aviation community. The USCG loves you as does our entire Nation. God Bless the USCG! Get your copy today! A hair-raising story of life and death. **TW**

ROBO CALLS ARE DRIVING US MAD!

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — In November Attorney General Ashley Moody is leading the efforts to gather support for the Federal Communications Commission's attempts to fight illegal robocalls within the United States. Phone Scammers are finding ways to circumvent or work-around previously implemented antirobocall technologies to continue tormenting and or crooking Florida citizens with phone calls, cell calls or just leaving scam messages for us to continually delete, and time taking chore at best.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Working with the FCC, we have been successful in reducing the number of scams and robocalls targeting Americans. Unfortunately, in recent months, scammers have found ways to circumvent the technology created to protect our citizens from fraudulent robocall messages. Today, I asked the FCC to continue its efforts to reduce the number of calls by implementing stricter processes on companies that assign and distribute telephone numbers."

Earlier this year, following efforts by Attorney General Moody and other attorneys general in other states, phone companies were required to implement a technology program called STIR/SHAKEN. This technology checks to see if a phone call comes from a legitimate source before the designated phone begins to ring. Since the FCC required large phone companies to begin using this technology in June, scam robocalls have dropped nearly 30 percent.

Scammers are now trying to circumvent the STIR/SHAKEN program by purchasing access to legitimate phone numbers to conceal their identities. Providing false information and shielding identities, scammers purchase access to legitimate phone numbers from companies that do not have strong know-your-customer policies. For STIR/SHAKEN to reach its full potential to reduce illegal robocalls, scammers cannot be allowed uninhibited access to legitimate phone numbers.

The FCC proposes to implement a more thorough application, review and monitoring process for phone companies that request direct access to phone numbers and to require these companies verify customers' identities to help keep the numbers from being sold, leased or rented to scammers for illegal robocall purposes. This includes limiting the use of temporary phone numbers for trial customers.

Attorney General Moody is leading a letter of support from attorneys general across the country. A copy of the letter is available via the official website for the Attorney General Office in Tallahassee.

In addition to Attorney General Moody, the following 50 attorneys general signed on to the letter: Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

So, there is hope after all folks, our cries to our Government in Tallahassee have paid off. I just hope their catch them and return all the money that they scammed from our Seniors. **TW**

A BIT OF HISTORY OF BURGESS CREEK By Tom Wynn

Burgess Creek was named after the man that owned it, Samuel Burgess. He was the settler of the area we know as Burgess Landing and Burgess Creek in the Dalkeith area of Calhoun County (Gulf Co. today since 1925). Sam was married to Alvenia Jone Burgress.

There was a trail that came down from Blue Gator to Willis Landing along the edge of the swampy areas. At Blue Gator there was a Ferry crossing over the West Arm Creek of what is known today as the Deadlakes. It was owned and operated by native Americans at the time, later on in history there was a bridge built and so we have the West Arm Creek Bridge that we love to take tons of pictures seasonally from (just be careful of the traffic when you do get that snapshot!).
