CITY COUNCIL TELLS OVER 20 WEWA FAMILIES THE CITY CAN NOT AFFORD TO PAVE THEIR DIRT ROAD

During the October city meeting several Wewa residents who live on Corn Griffin Street discussed their issues with the dirt road named after the famous Army and civilian Boxer who retired in Wewa many years ago. Telling the council how troubling it was to drive on the dirt road on rainy days and after with washboard ripples that would shake a mouth full of your teeth while traveling back and forth to town and work.

Mr. Jackie Husband, the City Engineer, was asked by Mayor Phillip Gaskin what the cost would be to pave that dirt road. Husband said a rough estimate would be about \$250,000 for ³/₄ of a mile of dirt road that has never been paved before.

The mayor said that it had never been prepared or paved before, it would be very costly to pave in today's prices thus the city could not afford to pave it. The community representatives, Mr. Royce Watkins, a retired Navy veteran, came before the board as did others who live on Corn Griffin Street, requesting the city to pave the road as soon as possible. At least 22 families live down that road and they all are paying taxes to the city and to the county.

Mayor Gaskin said that the city could not afford to have their road paved at that estimate.

He said his crew is working on the repairs of the building's windows, AC unit, walk-in freezer replacement (the City Council agreed to investigate the

cost of a new freezer that would hold a lot of frozen dinners that feed the senior citizens around the city who are homebound and those that come to the center daily. The city has made a major effort to restore the building to its former glory and make life better for the seniors who come to socialize with each other from Wewa and Port St. Joe, periodically. The city meetings are held in the same location monthly and any other special meetings that comes about.

The library has several programs lined up to complement our 2nd annual Wewahitchka Local History Day. This year's event will be held on Saturday, November 12 from 10:00-2:00 CT. View local artifacts on


display and speak with some of the locals that discovered these items. Browse our growing local history and genealogy collection. Local civic organizations will have booths set up to share information with the community. **Enjoy live music from Michael Lister and Greg Wood**. Free lunch will be served. For the kids, face painting and tattoos with be available. This event is free, and everyone is invited to join us.

Recently, the **Florida Public Archaeology Network** presented a Cemetery Resource Protection Program at the library. In partnership with the Wewahitchka Historical Society, a morning session was held at the library, followed by a hands-on learning experience at Jehu Cemetery.

On Friday November 18th at 10:00 a.m. CT the Florida Public Archaeology Network will visit the library to present, "Archaeology of Northwest Florida: a tour through our heritage. This presentation features a virtual tour of the major archaeological discoveries in the Panhandle of Florida. You'll learn about 16th-century shipwrecks, Native American encampments and ceremonial centers, a civil war gun battery, a Spanish fort and mission, historic cemeteries, and the nation's oldest battleship!

On December 5 at 2 p.m. CT join us for a Virtual/In-Person program, "Gulf County During WWII". Explore some of the resources available at the State Archives of Florida and learn how they can help us understand how the state navigated World War II on the home front. From patrolling for submarines in fishing boats to buying war bonds, Floridians invested their time, money and skills in victory. Join archivist Matthew Storey, Florida Archives Historian, to discover more about using records at the State Archives to reveal details on how the state and citizens worked together in extraordinary times. I was 5 years old in the year of 1968 and I was excited about my first day kindergarten. mama took me to what is now the Wewa Senior Center. I did my 1/2 day, and teacher(s) were waiting for someone to pick me up. My parents worked for the Florida Forest Service, and both were working that day. My teacher(s) had to drive me 14 miles to my house in

Overstreet. My teacher/driver informed my mama that she couldn't drive me home every day. After I was told I wouldn't be going back to kindergarten, I curled up in a chair and said, "I guess I have to go back to work." When I was an infant until I was able to walk Gene Hanlon's mom, Mary Frances, tended to me while my mama was in the fire tower. Mama would tell me it's time to go to work, maybe that's why I was excited to start kindergarten. I was working and not getting paid. Because I couldn't go to kindergarten my mama became my teacher. My mama, Verna Marshall, taught me my letters, numbers, and colors. To be in 1st grade I had to take a test. My mama was worried that I wouldn't score high enough to enter 1st grade. As far as ranking I came in 2nd. The Overstreet fire tower became my 1st classroom. Thank you, mama. You were a great teacher!



It is a wise idea to never point laser light directly at a human or paint a car or truck with a laser light. Never point one at your family pet or any animal in the face. Never point one at your own face. Never point at a laser at an airplane either.

Having spent 20 years flying in helicopters and fixed wing planes, I know the dangers of pointing a laser light beam at pilots. Not only can you potentially blind them, but you could also cause a crash of that aircraft "Danger Will Robinson, Danger!" As the Robot would say to Will in The Lost in Space series.

Having done the research for a traffic ticket case once I found the U.S. Air Force research on the subject matter in their medical manual. Class 3 Lasers produce dangerous laser light when turned on and aimed at the eyes.

Please consider this: The Florida Statue says it is a 3rd degree felony see Florida Statue 784.062 (3)(a) and (b) causing injury to the eyes. Not to mention the Civil and Tort lawsuits that could result in you pointing a laser at someone and causing bodily injury.
