DECEMBER CITY COUNCIL MEETING FIRE STATION AND GARBAGE BIDS

The City of Wewahitchka city commissioners voted 5 to 0 approving the city lawyer contact the bonding company of the contractor who is building the new fire station, due to the city complaints of noncompliance of the contract and other issues. The mayor as well as the entire Wewahitchka City Commission all agreed the quality of the fire house construction is subpar.

The Commissioners acted in total agreement to contact the bonding company concerning the fire station, based on the Commissioners, the city lawyer and Jack Husband's input.

The work thus far, at the time of the meeting, was 12 days pass the time limit in the contract. They all agreed, including the city lawyer, that something had to be done.

The Council also voted 5 to 0 to allow the city manager and the city clerks to review the various garbage contracts that were sent (sealed bids) to the city by garbage collection companies in hopes of winning the bid to pick up the city garbage weekly. The City Commission and the mayor, thanked the city workers for their hard work, making note that Ms. Rachel and her co-workers have done a great job for the city. The mayor commented on the fine the work city employees do for our city.

The Comp Plan bids, and grant writer ads need to be placed as per the mayor. Ms. Rachel gave updated information the commission.

Commissioner Ralph Fisher commented and pointed out that Mrs. Peggy Causey worked on Buckhorn Cemetery by making decorations for the gravesites.

Tom Wynn spoke up on behalf of the Senior Citizens Center that the building's closet floor was damaged and in need of repair. The mayor asked Chipper Wade to investigate the issue. The meeting was short and to the point. TW

WEWAHITCHKA HISTORICAL GROUP NEWS

Carol Wood from the Presbyterian Church informed members that two grants from FEMA have been approved. Monies from these grants will be used to pay for raising the church, caused by damage from Hurricane Michael, and putting down a new foundation. As of this date volunteers from the Historical Group, the church, and community members have cleaned 455 bricks and counting. These bricks are the original bricks that were used to build the foundation for the church. After all the bricks are cleaned, they will be used to build steps going into the church. Carol also informed members that the beam under the belltower will need to be replaced. She added that an estimate for lead paint abatement will be approximately \$12,000. She is working on an amendment to the T-Mobile grant due to unforeseen problems. Painting estimate is approximately \$25,000. An estimate for the replacement of windows wasn't available. Discussion was made among members to invite high school students to our meeting in hopes of getting them interested in Wewa history. Student membership will be free.

President Ann Johnson will be visiting the high school to speak to the students about the work our group is doing, and about projects in the future. Our Afghan project has been very, very successful. We have sold 165 Afghans and will be designing a new one for 2022. We are very excited about how successful this project has been. Ann also informed everyone that Domino Demunck will be taking members on a field trip to his property in Stonemill Creek sometime in January. The next meeting of the Wewahitchka Historical Group will be held on Thursday, January 20, 2022, at the Corner Café at 6:00 PM CST. DS


