WEWAHITCHKA SENIOR CITIZEN'S HAS MEETING OF THE MINDS-GETTING THINGS DONE WITH THE CITY COMMISSION

The March City meeting was full of subject matter, and a lot of topics was discussed, here is a few topics covered: The head of the Gulf County Senior Citizens Centers came to talk with the City Commission about several issues that needed fixing in the Senior Citizen Building, where Seniors meet daily, and the City has their meetings as of late (see city side notes page 19)

To everyone's delight the city commission voted to pay half for a new Oven (\$2500 if the County would pay the other half) for the Senior Citizens Center kitchen and agreed by a vote of 5 to 0. They got word about the roof leaking in the kitchen above the ceiling fan and lights as well. The two gentlemen who oversee the program for the county, Mr. Eddie Fields and Mr. Robert Farmer (both military veterans) as well as Ms. Renece Grainer, Sight Manager-1 (she runs the program in Wewa) was on hand to answer questions from the Board and to inform the Commission of their concerns and issues with the building maintenance issues.

Commissioner Brian Cox said he had put in a work order to make repairs to the entrance doors, while Mayor Gaskin said this was the first time, he was hearing of a roof leak. He assured everyone that the roof would be repaired (Michael Gortman, City Manager quickly stood up and asked Ms. Renece to point out where the water was coming in).

CITY ELECTIONS COMING THIS FALL

The city commission invited Mr. John Hanlon to come to the city meeting to discuss this year's city elections and the cost of letting the Gulf County Elections Office manage the election process for the city. Mr. Hanlon said that if the city tied their election with the gulf county elections, he could reduce the costs down as little as 3 to 5 hundred dollars but to have the election on another date, it could climb as high as 5 thousand dollars(more on this in the coming months folks).

WEWA ELEMENTARY STUDENT ARRESTED FOR A WRITTEN BOMB THREAT

Gulf County Sheriff's Office (GCSO) Deputies responded to Wewahitchka Elementary School (WES) around 11:30 AM on March the 23rd after the School Resource Deputy was notified of a written bomb threat. The school's administrators worked in conjunction with the County Sheriff Office evacuating the students to a safe location while the Sheriff Office investigated.

Investigators learned the written threat was presented to a teacher by a student (age 12). The threat read, "I am going to kill someone with this bomb." The suspect was quickly found and interviewed. Jessalyn Jade Wilkerson admitted to investigators that she wrote the note and took it to a teacher.

Students returned to campus after the school was deemed safe by Investigators. Subsequently, Ms. Wilkerson was placed under arrest and charged with one count of Written Threat to Discharge an Explosive Device (which is a 2nd Degree Felony) and one count of Interfering with a School Function (2nd Degree Misdemeanor). She was held for her first appearance at the Bay Regional Juvenile Detention Center.

"I'm proud of the hard work of our law enforcement and school officials who worked together to bring this to a conclusion," said Sheriff Mike Harrison. "We are committed to the safety of each student and staff member. We will continue to take each of these cases very seriously."






Air Medal [Army] (2006–present)

Currently (as per AR 600-8-22 [December 11, 2006])¹² the medal can be awarded for every six months of meritorious service. The recipient must perform flight-related duties while serving in a combat zone. The number of flight hours logged is no longer a criterion. The soldier must be assigned as air crew with flight status (i.e., as a pilot, navigator, or gunner). Soldiers without flight status can be eligible if they help with an aerial attack during general transport (e.g., as a door gunner), serve as a combat controller (e.g., as a Pathfinder or Forward Air Controller) or the combat commander of an air or land operation at the Group or Brigade level or lower. Soldiers being transported by air as passengers are not eligible for the meritorious service award, but they may be eligible for the gallantry award.
