CORN GRIFFIN STREET FROM DIRT TO PAVEMENT-WILL IT EVER HAPPEN?

Mr. James Royce Watkins, one of the spokesmen for the 24 families on Corn Griffin dirt road, stood before the City Council asking for the latest status on the possibilities of his and 23 other families getting their street paved. The residents of the dirt road community on Corn Griffin continue to ask Gulf County and the city to fix their road and its various issues.

The Mayor, Phillip Gaskin and the city Manager, Michael Gortman continue to work with the Gulf County Admin to find money and make repairs as rain and truck traffic makes the **(Story continues page 2)**

road rough and hard to travel on after a rain. Mr. Jack Husband, the city Engineer and the Mayor explained the cost and what was possible with grants for road paving. Most of that kind of work in a city and county comes from Grants awarded by various organizations coming from the State of Florida and the Federal government.

grants and work with the Gulf County Road department, who are doing what they can to help the situation.

Gulf County Commissioner Mr. David Rich agreed to come to the February City Commissioner’s meeting to discuss the situation. He too has been working to find grant money to pave the half mile dirt road. Mr. Watkins and Rich are in communication as well on this matter.

Mayor Gaskin and Mr. Jack Husband agreed that the cost in today’s dollars would be about \$220,000 to get the job done. The city agreed to continue to look for funds via grants. City Clerk Rachel Jackson has researched infrastructure grants and is an expert in grant writing, we are told. There are various means of funding of the type, including a bond fund that the city and the county agreed to many years ago. The bond money would be about half a million dollars for Wewa to re-pave roads whenever we ever see the money. Commissioner Rich and Watkins are in contact with each other on the matter since the city meeting. TW

The Charles Whitehead Public Library has access to a number of databases that are free with a library card. Library cards are Free to local residents.

If you are interested in genealogy, you might find the following databases helpful to your research: Ancestry.com, Family Search, Florida's Hidden Treasures, American Ancestors, Heritage Quest Online, Newspaper Archive, and Bay County Obituary index.

For those people looking for a job, A to Z is the premier job search, reference & mailing list database including 30 million businesses and executive profiles.

The Black Freedom Struggle website features expertly selected open primary source documents. Visitors will find historical newspaper articles, pamphlets, diaries, correspondence and more from specific time periods in U.S. history marked by the opposition African Americans have faced on the road to freedom.

The Artist Works link provides hundreds of free music lessons, taught by professional musicians through your Libby app on device or through your computer. Step through instructions provided in the links.

With Comics Plus, you have unlimited access to thousands of digital comics, graphic novels, and manga from a variety of library-friendly publishers.

Gale Books & Authors provides new ways to explore the endless possibilities and combinations of books, authors and topics. Adapted from Gale's acclaimed What Do I Read Next?

We have a small e-book collection through EBSCO Host. Check out electronic books or download audio books to your computer. Sign up for a free EBSCO Host account, and then access from anywhere.

The Florida Electronic Library includes a vast research service provided by the State Library of Florida. The site can be accessed from any computer in the state of Florida. No log-in is necessary.

Gale Cengage Learning is a source for news and periodical articles on a wide range of topics, both general and scholarly. With over 9000 titles, 4000 of them are full text. There are specific databases for computers, health, education, business, and student homework.

Salem Literature includes access to Magill's Medical Guide, Seventh Edition. Requires library card number for access.

Worldcat.Org allows you to find items in over 10,000 libraries worldwide, including books, DVDs, CDs, and journal articles. Useful for Interlibrary Loan and can be personalized with your own lists, bibliographies and reviews. No log-in necessary to search.

Weiss Financial Ratings Series Online allows you to check investment ratings in stocks, compare bank and insurance options, create a personal Medicare Supplement Buyer's Guide Report, and access Financial Literacy resources for planning for your financial future.

EVER WONDER WHERE TUPELO HONEY COMES FROM?



**A HISTORICAL WEWA FIGURE
J.L. "DADDY DOC" JOHNS**

Pictured above is one of my favorite Wewahitchkaians folks, Daddy Doc and his lovely wife Sarah Ruth. He was one of my favorite lunch buddies of yesteryear. He was my friend and brother of a different mother. He loved the Lord with all his heart and his 6 daughters as well. He told me all 6 daughters married preachers and he was proud of them all. He died at the ripe old age of 101. I went to his 100th birthday party in Panama City, that was the last time I saw him.

He would tell me stories of his younger days as a painter in Miami and how he loved to garden in his own yard. I asked him one day how he lived so long (he was 96 at the time). He told me he lived so long because he ate out of his own garden most of the time (yet we met in our local restaurants when we were doing our talks, LOL). He said the secret of long life was to have the Lord in your heart and grow your own food very close to you, as to grow it on your own property and eat it soon after you picked it from the land, that makes sure the vitamins and minerals made into you quickly.

He told me a story about how he worked for Al Capone, the notorious Chicago Gangster who lived in Miami after they released him from Alcatraz prison in the middle of the bay in San Francisco. He was dying of a disease of the brain and did not have long to live, so they released him. Daddy Doc was hired to repair a bullet hole in the ceiling in the entrance way of his mansion in Miami. butler told him not to make Al mad, because he carried a gun and would shoot him. "He was crazy!", he said.

So, Daddy Doc did his job and was paid in full. Later he was called back to do more work, having passed the test with his first job, they hired him to continue painting the rest of the house. He kept his mouth shut and never told anyone about what he saw or heard. Men would come in, but he never saw them leave Hmm...?

I miss that old man; he was a mentor and good example to the community. He was still driving at 100, but too fast! So, his family hid his keys, but he would find a spare, so they disconnected his battery so he couldn't drive anymore.

During hurricane Michael, Gulf County had emergency radio comms but since then, the county system seems to be in disrepair and one of the groups originators has made several attempts to contact the Gulf County office for emergency comms, via U.S. Mail three times, to no avail.

So, several of the locals have decided to create a new form of comms between themselves in case the Gulf emergency comms system is inoperative during the next big event.

CONSIDER FLORIDA'S TORREYA STATE PARK FOR A FUN DAY AND BRING A PICNIC TOO!

Not far from Wewahitchka is a beautiful Florida State Park that few newbies know about. So, consider taking a day trip and going to visit this beautiful hidden park. My father took me to Terrya State Park in the 1970's best I remember. He had been doing research in that area and found this amazing place in Florida north country.

If you will trip up north up to highway 12 and make a left turn on 27 (watch for signs) you go down for several miles of hilly countryside and there it be! Hang on for an amazing day. It is a must to take a tour of the Old **Gregory Mansion** and walk down the foot trail in front of the Mansion. It can be steep so be careful. You will not be disappointed. When you look out, standing behind the Mansion you can see for at least 50 miles, I was told. The park is on a high ridge, and you will understand why Mr. Gergory build his mansion there.

The quiet southern charm is off the beaten path of normal driving to and from Tallahassee as us Wewa folks do for shopping and doctor appointments. This place is a botanist and historian paradise filled with Florida history, character and favor of our old past. This state park is a pure blessing to the eye and the soul of those in need of a place to relax, explore and just be outside.

The park covers 13,735 acres in the Rock Bluff community about 13 miles from Bristol Florida, if you are coming from Wewa.

It gets its name from a rare Florida Tree called Torreya Tree, which was named after a Florida Botanist Dr. John Torrey. In 1834, Croom found here the still rarer Florida Yew tree, which resembles the Torreya tree.

The high bluff overlooks the Apalachicola River. The mansion was built in the "Greek Revival" architecture.

Just down from the mansion are six-gun pits dug by the Confederates guarding the river against the ascent of the Federal gunboats. The River was once a main travel route for commerce and social life in north Florida. At various times in history, Native American Indians, Spanish, British, French, Americans, Confederate and Federal troops used it for Traveling (did I leave anyone one out?)

There is a fee to tour the mansion, so check in with the park Ranger. They are full of information and are glad to tell you about it.

There is Tent camping and Trailer camping as well. So, dig in before you go online and find out all the details, so you will be prepared to have a great time. Bring a picnic basket and drinks for your visit, you will be glad you did.

If you are a bird lover or animal lover, this is a place for you to visit. I would not bring cats and dogs, as they could bring wildlife near you, and you cannot control them at times. Why spoil others' time in the park? Leave them at home.

Make sure you keep your phones and keys on your body and lock your cars and trucks etc. You never know who is in the woods. Alcohol is not allowed in the park last time I was there.

Look folks! This is your history, your USA history, your local history and your Florida history. Do as my father did and as I did, take your kids and your neighbors on a short road trip and enjoy life before you can't! In case you need the address for your GPS:
