### CORN GRIFFIN STREET FROM DIRT TO PAVEMENT-WILL IT EVER HAPPEN? GOOD NEWS! COUNTY AND CITY CAME FOR A LOOK SEE AND HAS A PLAN!

Mr. James Royce Watkins, one of the spokesmen for the 24 families on Corn Griffin dirt road, who stood before the City Council several times was with Commissioner Johnny Paul and watched as the Contractor bulldozed Corn Griffin Road moving the dirt and small rocks in attempt to make it better for traffic down the road. The Gulf County Road Department and Administration offices are working to improve the road by digging ditches and correcting the edge of the road for better water drainage.

Later in the February city meeting County Administrator Michael Hammond and County Commissioner David Rich (District 1) were on hand to discuss the road and other topics of interest to the city and to the public. (I was not able to attend, due to an out-of-town family visit. Please see Ms. Wendy Weitzel , editor of The Star Newspaper article on-line for more details, as she attended the meeting).

The residents of the dirt road community on Corn Griffin continue to ask Gulf County and the city to fix their road and its various issues.

The mayor, Phillip Gaskin and the city commission, as well as, Michael Gortman, the city manager, continue to work with the Gulf County admin to find money and make repairs as rain and truck traffic makes the road unbearable for those that live on Corn Griffin Road. As we approach another rainy season in the Springtime here, it will become important for the CGR community to have it drained properly, as a minimum. By all accounts the city and the Gulf County Road crew are working together to help out until money comes to pave the road. (See CGR story on page 2)

The Gulf County Road department has been overwhelmed this past year with flooding and ditches filled with tree branches and other things, needing cleaning out all at once. They are hard at work to make things better with their present workforce and budget.

Gulf County Commissioner Mr. David Rich agreed to come to the February City Commissioner’s meeting to discuss the situation. He too has been working to find grant money to pave the half mile dirt road. Mr. Watkins, Mr. Michael Hammond, the County Administration Officer and Commissioner David Rich are in communication with the city and the families of CGR community.

Mayor Gaskin and Mr. Jack Husband agreed that the cost in today’s dollars would be about \$220,000 to have the road paved properly. The County and the City are working together now to improve the situation on CGR. City Clerk Rachel Jackson has researched infrastructure grants and is an expert in grant writing, we are told. The city commission said in the January meeting that the bond money would be about half a million dollars for Wewa to re-pave roads. Commissioner Rich and Watkins are in contact with each other on the matter since the city meetings, over the past month now, it pays to come to city meetings and let them know, when things are not right in the community. In most cases, if possible, the Commission moves quickly. TW

## CITY LAWYER REPORTS NEW ISSUE WITH FIREHOUSE LAWSUIT

The City Attorney, Ms. Michelle Jordan notified the city mayor and city commission that Mr. Tommy Hamm (the contractor who was building the new Fire Station on 2<sup>nd</sup>

street) has filed for bankruptcy and Wewa will have to hire a bankruptcy attorney to assist her in the lawsuits with Mr. Hamm. She stated that she is not a bankruptcy attorney and could not represent the city in that matter. Winterfell Construction Inc. and the owners of said company, Mr. Tommy Hamm and his wife Mrs. Jamie Hamm has filed for chapter 11, according to Attorney Jordan. In the February meeting, County Admin Officer Mr. Michael Hammond offered the city the county's assistance in the matter, including a possible interest free loan from the county to finish the project. (Personal note-in my service in the USCG Aviation community for over 20 years, we had to wash our aircraft every time we used them within 25 miles of the saltwater to prevent rust and corrosion. So, I know the effects of what salt air can do to metal aircraft as well as trucks and cars. They need protection from the salt air, and Fire Houses do this, with their closed doors, and careful washing of all equipment regularly).

Our Fire Department is top-notch! And does all it can do to protect our valuable trucks and equipment which cost the tax-payers thousands of dollars. Our trucks are presently being stored at the city road department under a roof of protection. They can be easily accessed for fire and other needs, quickly! So not to worry over that. The City Commission and the City Manager are doing all they can to get them under a new roof of protection and safety for fast deployment in case of fire and emergency. TW

It has been busy at the Wewahitchka Library lately! Spring has sprung, bringing in many eager taxpayers. VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) in partnership with United Way, has returned for the second year at our library to provide FREE tax preparation services to our community. Last year the VITA

team completed 196 tax returns and residents received \$230,000 tax returns in both Gulf County Libraries. As of February, our numbers are double compared to 2022. If you are interested in having your taxes prepared for free by a VITA volunteer, please call (850) 227-8737 and leave your name and phone number for a return call. Appointments are required. VITA offers free tax filing help to residents who earn a moderate income, to people who are over the age of 65, disabled or do not speak English well. IRS-certified volunteers provide basic income tax preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals.



# THE WEWA NEWS CELEBRATE'S TWO YEARS

It has been two years this month that Tom Wynn asked a question of the Mayor, Phillip Gaskin: “**Mayor, what happened to the 6 million dollars BP Oil Spill money that Wewa was supposed to get?**” The mayor replied, with a pointed finger and a smile on his face, “I want to know too Tom!”. I told him I will investigate it for both of us. And so, history was made, **THE WEWA NEWS**™ was reborn since its closing back in 1996.

Back in 1996 the Wynn family shut down The Wewa News newspaper to help the Brown Family start up the old Gulf County Breeze Newspaper of the good old days (started by Mr. Claude Hanlon back in 1925) and sold to Ed Bandjough. The Brown family purchased the paper from Mrs. Bandjough in the mid 90’s.

My investigation of the BP Oil Spill turned out to be a two-part series in The Wewa News, March and May issues of 2021. It was not 6 million dollars, but 12 million dollars and has yet to be given to Wewahitchka to this day. It was scheduled to be given to Wewa back in 2018, and it was in LOT 3. At the time, no one could answer my question, what is LOT 3? Mrs. Becky Norris (Gulf County Clerk of the Court) was asked about the money and later on she provided an email with the original documents attached. So I went from there. Two articles told the story and the plan for Gulf County and especially for Wewa and what the money would be used for. ## VITA

### IRS TAX PREPARATION IN THE WEWA LIBRARY

#### GIVE THEM A CALL

Ms. Joan Hill, a volunteer of United Way of Northwest Florida is head of the service VITA, that has set up in the Wewahitchka Library for those that live in the area. Several citizens of Wewa have been specially trained to help locals get their tax returns completed.

This program is in both counties of Bay and Gulf. They have two locations in Gulf County, Port St. Joe Library and Wewa Library. The United Way of Northwest Florida asked for a grant so volunteers can be trained to help our local folks with their income tax returns. With their aid our people can use the "Vita" program, which is the funding for them to buy much needed supplies, like computers and other equipment, in order to help "low to moderate income" taxpayers. The money for this grant comes from the IRS. They applied for a grant for 2021 tax season and were awarded the grant, which they were able to buy printers and banners to let people know they are there in the library to help them with their IRS taxes.

VITA is a 501-C3 organization. United Way of Panama City handles the Gulf County area. They will aid Taxpayers up to April 18<sup>th</sup> as their final day in Wewa and as for Port St. Joe it will be April 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Ms. Hill, how long does it take to get Tax refunds right now?** "It takes about three weeks for returns to come back to the taxpayer at this time in the season. Right now, at the beginning of the season people were getting them as soon as a couple of days later, but as millions of people start filing their returns, it will take a little bit longer, so early bird gets the worm! The money comes faster for those that file early. So, the later you wait the longer it'll take for those that wait to the last minute. We did 200 tax returns for the whole season last year by the 20<sup>th</sup> of April. This year, on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February the numbers are already at 100, they are going to surpass all numbers from last year. Word of mouth has

certainly worked, she said. "We do have volunteers, but we are still looking for more volunteers."

"But as the program gets more and more known, in the area of course, the numbers get higher and higher. As far as the extensive training, we have two types of volunteers at our tax sites here in Gulf County, there are greeters, and then there are tax preparers.

The Greeter's do have to complete two certification tests. They serve a very useful role because they're kind of "crowd control" you know when you have 10 people waiting on you, so they help with that. We are on an "appointment only" program. That makes a difference to make things go easier for us and the taxpayer.

The second type of volunteer is the tax preparer. Those that do that are Ms. Barbara Matthews and Ms. Carol Childress who are tax preparer volunteers this year.

As for the military personnel, I've got in Port Saint Joe a gentleman that is certified in the military and ,myself as well, the two of us, can do military tax returns, we must have two people because we don't have just one person do a return-one person prepares it and another person reviews it and that's why if I make an error, or a data problem they'll catch it and then when I print it, I might catch something also. That's kind of how it works, we always must have two people, especially for military tax returns."

**What kind of I.D. must someone show to the tax preparer?** "Yes, they will need two forms of I.D., a picture I.D. and their social Security card for everybody on the return, including the dependents (for military dependents as well) for us to operate as a free site we have to do an Identity check."

**How does a Taxpayer contact you?** "Let me give you the phone number for appointments. Sometimes taxpayers do have a difficult time going online and making their appointment themselves, or they just rather talk to somebody, and they would call our tax site cell phone, and that number is 850-227-8737. They should leave a message because we are typically with taxpayers and cannot pick up the phone. They should also leave a message with their name and number, and someone will get back with them typically within a day or two."



# First Baptist Church of Wewahitchka The Old Makes Room For The New!

West Arm Creek bridge just north of the sweetest little city in Florida was the beginning of what we call today Wewa. It was first named "NEW EDEN". Just to the right before you get to the bridge is Jehu Cemetery Road, as you come around the road on the right (having been organized about 1840), the First Baptist Church of Wewahitchka was built by the

pioneers who settled here back in the beginning of Florida. A Methodist Church was first, then came First Baptist Church. That building was later moved to Highway 71 across from what is "The Subway" restaurant today having been moved by giant trees as used for rollers, with oxen and horses, then turned to face the highway. Again, later it was turned sideways facing Church Street and new construction was attached to it.

As of this week, the FBC tore down the old building in the back due to Hurricane Michael damage, with plans to build anew. I was there to capture a few pictures of the event. Brother Mike Stroud was the team leader in its safe removal. They saved several pieces for historical reasons and other pieces of wood for reuse. It was an amazing event to see. I was thankful I was there for this historical event in Wewa.

For those that remember Bo John Lester and where his house is still standing on Jehu Road-that is the very spot where the original First Baptist Church stood. Later in 1891, the church building was moved to its present location today on highway 71. The Deacons (Trustees) E.Z. Taylor, Dawson Stone, and N.A. Connell were listed in the original deed. I love Wewa history as you all know by



now. So, this was a nice treat for me. Brother Mike loves to work on the Baptist Church and thus knows nearly every inch of the old parts. Our First Baptist Church is one of the oldest in the State. In the early years of Wewa life, preachers would come down from our neighbors in the north end of the county (We were part of Calhoun County back then, prior to 1925) from Blountstown and from the South, Apalachicola as well. They were known as Circuit Preachers back in the day, traveling to areas that had no preachers or pastors or church buildings, remember this is in the early pioneer days of Florida. These preachers traveled through the woods on dirt roads and trails with swamps, bugs, snakes as well as bears and Indians. No telling what else all in the name of the Lord to share the gospel ministering to anyone that came to the

meetings. In June 1996, the church called Brother Mike Stroud as pastor, with his lovely wife Sister Robin and so he is the present Pastor today. At that time in history, I reported Brother Mike's arrival in the old Wewa News in the mid 1990's. I found the article when I was reading through the old Wewa News newspapers, a few months back.

They will create a 501-3c organization that would be ready for the next major event, having radio communications between each other and be able to relay up and down highway 71 as far as Blountstown by volunteers along the route, to get emergency services, passing important information up and down the Highway to our neighbors, if power and cell phone services fails. Your cost would be \$160 dollars for the radio and antenna in total. It would be powered by a 12v battery, it could be used in your house or in a car or truck etc. The license from the U.S. Government would cost \$35 dollars for the whole household (including children) and can be bought online at Amazon.com through a company called "GMRS RADIO SERVICE". ## How Weather Affects Citrus and Other Dooryard Fruit Varieties

The weather is the most important factor determining where certain fruits can be successfully grown. Terms such as chilling requirement and cold hardiness play a major role in both species and variety selection.

Most fruits which grow in the Panhandle are deciduous, meaning that during the winter, they lose their leaves and go through a semi to full dormancy period. This period is a much-needed rest and reset for the plant. The cool season actually helps the plant to rebound for another fruiting season and affects how well the plant will yield fruit. This is where the term “chilling hours” comes into play.

Temperatures below 45 degrees Fahrenheit are considered “chilling”. The number of hours below 45 degrees accumulated throughout the winter determines the total number of chilling hours. Different species of citrus and dooryard fruit, along with different cultivars of these plants differ in the number of chilling hours needed for that all important rest/reset period. Satsuma is a popular fruit tree in our area, as it is by far the most cold hardy citrus. Evidence suggests that the satsuma can survive a temperature as low as 14 degrees Fahrenheit.

### Mature Satsumas Ready For Harvest

What happens if the plant doesn't receive the needed number of chilling hours? Plant hormones can be disrupted, and both leafing and blooming could be light and occur outside of the normal range of the season. So, where do we stand in the Panhandle for overall chilling hours? Typically, we see approximately 500 chilling hours. Therefore, it is best to plant citrus and dooryard fruit that have the characteristic of needing 500 or less hours for chilling. Please see this informative document on citrus and dooryard fruit varieties: <https://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/publication/MG248> Now, on to the term cold hardiness. By definition, this is the plant's ability to withstand cool season temperatures without injury. Most tropical fruits cannot tolerate our Panhandle temperatures. Those of us that cut back banana trees every year know this all too well, our hardiness zone is either 8b/9a, depending on your location within the county. To check your plant hardiness zone, please see the
